# FINANCIAL AID BASICS

## 1. COMPLETE A FAFSA

### FAFSA.GOV

- You must complete this application to determine your eligibility for grants, scholarships and loans.
- It's FREE to apply. Need help? Assistance is available in the financial aid office.
- Be sure to use Metropolitan Community College's school code **002484** on your application.
- You will need your (and your parents if applicable) financial information such as your income tax information to complete the FAFSA.
- Apply for a FSA ID at **studentaid.gov** to sign and submit your FAFSA electronically.

## 2. CHECK YOUR EMAIL AND myMCCKC STUDENT CENTER

- Your FAFSA results known as a Student Aid Report will be sent to the email you listed on your application. Review for comments, additional steps or needed corrections.
- Log into your myMCCKC student center to review your To Do List. You must complete the steps there before your financial aid can be finalized.

## 3. APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

## STUDENT LOANS

- Students interested in student loans must fill out the Student Loan Intake form. First time borrowers must also sign up for a student loan information session in the Financial Aid Office. If you've borrowed before, you're encouraged to attend this session.
- You must be enrolled in at least 6 credit hours in the Fall and Spring or 3 credit hours in the Summer to qualify for a loan.

## SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS

- You must maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA and complete 67 percent of all courses enrolled.
- Your SAP is calculated using ALL of your classes from every college you have attended. We must have all of your transcripts on file to accurately calculate your SAP and determine your eligibility for financial aid.

## CHANGING YOUR ENROLLMENT

- Adding and dropping classes can change your financial aid eligibility. Always check with an advisor first.
- Failure to successfully complete your classes or completely withdrawing before the end of the semester can make you ineligible for aid you have already received and you will be required to pay it back immediately.
