

PROFESSIONAL NURSING REQUIREMENTS CHECKLIST

Evening/Weekend

Deadline to meet all the application period requirements for spring semester is **September 5**.

Traditional (Day)

Deadline to meet all the application period requirements for fall semester is **March 29**.

Note: This includes students with degrees and previous college course work. (If you are an LPN please review the LPN-ADN BRIDGE NURSING REQUIREMENTS CHECKLIST).

The following five (5) items must be completed and satisfied by the deadlines to be considered:

1. **Apply to MCC.** Fill out the general MCC application at www.mcckc.edu/apply-now.
2. **Submit all non-MCCKC official transcripts.** Send official transcripts from all institutions where you have earned college credits to: MCC Student Data Center, 3200 Broadway, Kansas City, MO 64111 OR electronically at transcripts@mcckc.edu.
3. **Take Accuplacer test regardless of previous college course work, there are no exceptions** (ACT/SAT scores will not be accepted). **Note: Failure to take all three sections of the Accuplacer by the deadlines will result in the application being removed from the applicant pool.** Test scores must be less than three (3) years old, and must meet or exceed the required scores in all three sections; Algebra, Reading, and Writing. All required scores must be obtained on either a first or second attempt when taking the test. Failure to meet the required scores on the second attempt will require the student to take the indicated required classes. Students will not be eligible to apply until the required course(s) listed (see table below) have been completed with a grade letter of "C" or higher. **Please visit <https://mcckc.edu/testing/> to review practice links.** These are the required scores and classes for each section:

4. **Completion of prerequisite courses with a minimum 3.0 GPA.** **Note: "B" letter grades or higher is ideal to reach the minimum 3.0 required GPA.** The following must be completed with a grade letter of "C" or higher:
 - Chem 105 Introduction to Chemistry for Health Professionals**
 - ✓ Must be six (6) years or less by the deadline
 - ✓ Maximum of two attempts in the last six (6) years
 - Biol 109 Anatomy & Physiology or Biol 110 Human Anatomy & Biol 210 Human Physiology**
 - ✓ Must be six (6) years or less by the deadline
 - ✓ Maximum of two attempts in the last six (6) years
 - Psyc 140 General Psychology**
 - ✓ Maximum of two attempts in the last six (6) years

Note: This course does not expire

Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), College Level Examination Program (CLEP) is accepted for admission into the nursing program. See scale below to view grade for prerequisite GPA for AP, IB and CLEP credit:

5. **Take the ATI TEAS exam.** The *ATI TEAS* exam must be taken by the application deadline and a minimum total adjusted score of **58.7%** must be obtained on either a first or second attempt in a calendar year (January - December). **Note: Failure to meet the required score on the second attempt will make you ineligible to be considered for the program during the calendar year when you tested.** For study materials and register visit www.atitesting.com. **(Page #5 contains additional information).**

Ranking Points

All applicants will be selected based on ranking points. A maximum of ten (10) possible ranking points can be obtained. Here is the example:

- Prerequisite GPA:** Up to a maximum of four (4) points based on prerequisite courses.
- Biol Microbiology 208:** Three (3) points for completed with a grade letter of “A” will be awarded. Two (2) points for completed with a grade letter of “B” will be awarded. One (1) point for completed with a grade letter of “C” will be awarded.
 - **Note:** This course must be six (6) years or less by the deadline and maximum of two attempts in the last six (6) years.
- CNA Certification:** One (1) point for students who hold a current *CNA Certification* will be awarded.
 - **Note:** Expired *CNA Certification* will not be awarded the extra point.
- ATI TEAS exam scores:** Two (2) points for scores in the range from 90.7% and higher. One (1) point for scores in the range from 78% to 90.6%.

Application Process

To make sure you are ready to apply, please review the **Requirements Evaluation Checklist** located on page #3. The following three (3) steps must be completed (step #3 only if applicable):

1. Applicants must submit the online application through the link provided under “Apply” on our Professional Nursing webpage at www.mcckc.edu/programs/professionalnursing.
 - **Note:** Part of the online application is to provide three (3) professional references. Each of the references will receive an e-mail with a survey which will need to be filled out and submitted by the reference by the end of the application period.
2. Attach **all ATI TEAS** scores to the online application before submitting.
3. Attach your current **CNA Certification** to the online application before submitting if applicable.
 - **Note:** Expired *CNA Certification* will not be awarded the extra point.

Admission criteria to the program are subject to change without notice. If changes are made to the admission criteria, the applicant will need to meet all requirements that are in effect at the time of application. Successful completion of the requirements necessary for admission to the program does not guarantee acceptance to the program.

Automatic disqualification. The following will result in the application being removed from the applicant pool (no exceptions):

- Not meeting the required ability to pass a drug screen once admitted to the Program.
- Not meeting the required ability to pass a background check screening once admitted to the Program.
- Previous dismissal from MCC’s professional nursing program.
- Not meeting the *Accuplacer* score requirement.
- Not meeting the required *Accuplacer* scores on the second attempt and/or not completing the required math, writing, or reading course(s) with a grade letter of “C” or higher.
- Not meeting the required *ATI TEAS* exam score on the second attempt in a calendar year.
- Not attaching **all ATI TEAS** exam scores and/or not showing all attempts.
- Not meeting the minimum 3.0 GPA from **Chem 105, Biol 109 or Biol 110 & Biol 210, and Psyc 140.**
- Science prerequisites (**Chem 105, Biol 109, or Biol 110 & Biol 210**) older than 6 (six) years by the application deadline.
- Three (3) or more graded attempts in all prerequisites (**Chem 105, Biol 109, or Biol 110 & Biol 210, and Psyc 140**) within a six (6) year period.
- Not submitting official transcripts from all institutions where you have earned college credits by the deadline.

- 4) MCC-Penn Valley test days are Monday-Friday, and Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday @ MCC-Maple Woods.
- 5) Payment of \$112 is required upon registration.
- 6) *Remote testing (take online)* - you must register 48 hours in advance of your desired test date.
In-Person - you must register 24 hours in advance of your desired test date.

Reading	55 minutes	Key ideas and details; craft and structure; and integration of knowledge and ideas – (45 questions)
Mathematics	57 minutes	Numbers, algebra and data interpretation and measurement – (38 questions)
Science	60 minutes	Human anatomy and physiology; life and physical sciences; and scientific reasoning – (50 questions)
English	37 minutes	Conventions of standard English, knowledge of language and vocabulary acquisition – (37 questions)

Total time: 209 minutes = 3 hrs 48 min
