The Kansas City families we help have dreams but limited means to make them reality. Their dreams are simple and basic. They are dreams that don't seem like dreams to others at all, but a right. They dream to decorate their own homes, and to live in a place where their kids can play safely. They dream to have a stable roof over their heads, that they can make memories under. These are good Kansas City people who need your help and this evening you have the opportunity to play a part in making those dreams come true.

Habitat for Humanity Kansas City is the seventh oldest affiliate of Habitat for Humanity International. We are a 501(c)(3) non-profit Christian ministry working to fulfill the dream of home ownership for low-income families in the greater Kansas City metropolitan area. Our goal is to provide decent, affordable homes to qualified families based on the principle found in Leviticus 25:35-37: *"If a brother living near you becomes poor, you must provide for him ...do not make a profit on the goods you sell him."*

With volunteer labor and donations of money and materials, Habitat for Humanity Kansas City (HFHKC) builds and rehabilitates houses in partnership with families in need. Habitat houses are affordable because there is no profit included in the sale price and no interest is charged on the mortgage. The family's monthly mortgage payments go into a revolving fund which is used to build more houses.

Volunteers—both skilled and unskilled—come as individuals or with groups from schools, churches, unions or businesses in our community. Construction become a cooperative effort involving these volunteer workers and the future homeowners.

The group has been featured with the Kansas City Symphony for *Carmen*, *Tosca*, Britten's *War Requiem*, Mahler's *Symphony No. 8*, and *The Magic of Christmas*. Music/Arts also prepared the child soloist for the newly commissioned *Summer Sun/Winter Moon* by Robert Kapilow. Founded in 1979, MAI® attracts more than 300 classical music students each year from a four state area. Students are noted for their sensitive, artistic performances and are recruited by prestigious schools of music for their college years. The classic music curriculum offered at MAI® encompasses private lessons in all orchestral and band instruments, voice, piano/organ and classical guitar. Additional programs include CrossPulse Ethnic Drum Ensemble and The MAI® Harp Choir.

Members of the choir come from several greater Kansas City cities: Blue Springs, Lee's Summit, Raytown, Grain Valley, Liberty, Kansas City, Lake Tapawingo, Sugar Creek, Buckner and Independence. Continuing enrollment allows children to audition at various times throughout the year.
