

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The CMT program teaches you to assist licensed practical nurses (LPNs) or registered nurses (RNs) in preparing, administrating and charting medications. You must have six months experience as a licensed certified nurse assistant (CNA) to take this class and sit for the certified medication technician (CMT) exam.

This course prepares individuals to become certified as medication technicians for employment in intermediate care or skilled nursing facilities. They will be qualified to administer selected categories of nonparenteral medications to residents of long-term care facilities and to assist licensed nursing personnel in medication therapy, according to state-approved curriculum.

- Two separate Mantoux Tuberculosis (TB) skin test results

- · Criminal Background check with MCC provider
