CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This course of study provides instruction on utilizing a humanistic approach to provide basic care to people in a variety of health care settings. Students will understand how health care systems operate and learn the skills necessary to function safely and efficiently in a health care setting. Students will learn the information and practical skills necessary for taking and passing the CNA certification exam required by the state.

The 175-hour training program includes 75 hours lecture and 100 hours clinical instruction. The clinical experience will be conducted in a long-term care facility under the supervision of an MCC clinical supervisor. This training will prepare you to take the both written and skills state board CNA exam.
