PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Insulin Administration training program prepares Certified Medication Technicians (CMT) in a skilled or intermediate care facility or Level I Medication Aides (LIMA) in a residential care facility (RCF) or assisted living facility (ACF) to administer insulin. The program is designed to present information on diabetes as it relates to symptoms and implications of proper or improper treatment and to teach skills in insulin administration in order to qualify students to perform this procedure in long-term care facilities in Missouri.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS

- Social Security Number
- 18 years of age (unless affiliated with a high school program)
- Government issued photo ID
- High school diploma or GED
- Completed MCC application – www.mcckc.edu/apply
- Current licensed Level 1 Medication Aide or a Certified Medication Technician
- Letter of recommendation on company letterhead from either the administrator or director of nursing of the facility where you have worked as a LIMA or CMT.
- Two separate Mantoux Tuberculosis (TB) skin test results
- Family Care Safety Registry – www.dhss.mo.gov/FCSR
- Criminal Background check with MCC provider
