Its origins include the merging of the Junior College Division of the Kansas City Polytechnic Institute, founded in 1915, with the Business Training, Engineering and Nurses Training divisions. In 1921, the Junior College added evening classes to accommodate full-time workers. After World War I, the school expanded its academic offerings to include occupational training and began attracting students from outlying communities beyond Kansas City, Missouri.

It is my distinct privilege to serve as the Chancellor of Metropolitan Community College. This institution has always been ahead of its time in recognizing the importance of offering student-centric academics based on real-world, occupational demands. For so many years, the College has answered the call of providing access to higher education for those who may not otherwise see higher education as a reality.

Private philanthropy is so invaluable to MCC's ability to achieve its mission of preparing students, serving communities and creating opportunities for all. *The Path Forward* has created new opportunities for expansion and growth in our communities, and we are incredibly grateful for the support received during Phase I of the campaign. THE PATH FORWARD MOVES ONWARD INTO PHASE II

The Path Forward campaign was established to provide funding for MCC’s most urgent scholarships, programs and capital goals. In Phase I, MCC completed three academic buildings: the Engineering Technology building at MCC-Penn Valley; the Advanced Technical Skills Institute on Troost Avenue, which now is home to many of the College’s career and technical programs; and the Blue River East expansion at MCC-Blue River.

Phase II of *The Path Forward* campaign will provide additional funding for MCC’s most urgent scholarships, programs and capital goals, including the development of MCC’s very own Agriculture Institute and Automotive Institute.

Scholarships *To remain the most affordable option for students*

Not only will *The Path Forward* ensure students continue to receive a quality education that offers a direct path to a solid career, but additional scholarships will help keep this path as affordable as possible. Scholarships to be funded include a variety of offerings: Completion Scholarships, Emergency Scholarships, Merit Scholarships and Need-based Scholarships.

Programs *To offer expanded, high-quality workforce and academic programs that align with identified needs in the Kansas City region*

New and existing programs have received support from *The Path Forward* as MCC recently opened three new academic buildings, with two additional projects on the horizon. Enhancements to existing programs will be funded in Phase II for the creation of MCC’s Automotive & Agriculture Institutes.

Capital *To offer the best teaching and learning environments for student learning*

Funding will support new construction and enhancements to existing facilities and much-needed equipment and technology to keep pace with 21st-century teaching methodologies. Technological challenges require ongoing upgrades to maintain a high level of excellence.

EVIDENCE OF PROVEN RESULTS IN PHASE I

MCC is grateful for the generosity from our donors received during Phase I of The Path Forward campaign. Their support allowed our College to open three new academic facilities on two of our campuses.

Engineering Technology building at MCC-Penn Valley

This 16,000-square-foot facility houses the Engineering and Computer Aided Drafting and Design programs, Fab Lab maker space, 3D Printing Lab, and the Burns and McDonnell Design Innovation Lab.

Advanced Technical Skills Institute at MCC-Penn Valley

This 100,000-square-foot-plus facility houses HVAC, Welding, Industrial Technology, Computer Integrated Machining and Manufacturing and Building Maintenance and Construction programs.



Blue River East expansion at MCC-Blue River

This 25,000-square-foot facility houses MCC's OSHA Education Center, CDL, Utility Lineman, Forklift and Warehousing programs.



GOALS FOR PHASE II OF *THE PATH FORWARD*

Phase II of The Path Forward campaign will turn to our MCC-Longview and MCC-Maple Woods campuses to establish an Automotive Institute and an Agriculture Institute for the greater Kansas City region and beyond. This final phase will allow MCC to expand its current offerings to accommodate the growth and need for future workers in these industries.

High-Technology Automotive Institute at MCC-Longview



High-Technology Automotive Institute at MCC-Longview will serve as the home of the region's premier Automotive programs. The project includes a 50,000-square-foot addition to the current High Technology building where the automotive technician and collision technician programs are currently housed. This project will both renovate and expand the footprint of the automotive space to accommodate for future program growth in diesel, heavy duty trucks and large vehicles, electric vehicles and powersports.



Agriculture Institute at MCC-Maple Woods



Agriculture Institute at MCC-Maple Woods will complement the existing Veterinary Technology program with the addition of three agriculture-related pathways: Plant Science, Agribusiness and Animal Science. This project will add a state-of-the-art facility which includes classroom, lecture and laboratory space, and a 2,000-square-foot greenhouse to suit the needs of agriculture science students at MCC.
