

## Associate in Arts - Teaching (A.A.T.)

## Music, Art, Physical Education, Foreign Language or Family and Consumer Science Education Emphasis - Advising Guide

Music, Art, Physical Education, Foreign Language, or Family and Consumer Science Education with Missouri state certification in one of the above specialty areas you will be qualified to teach that content grades k through 12. Appropriate electives for this pathway include: EDUC 235; EDUC 285; PSYC 243, or additional credits in the specialty subject area. The MCC EDUC faculty encourage students to pick their university and talk to the College of Education advisors there as soon as possible as they may direct you to even more specific electives to complete at MCC. In order to receive the degree of AAT, students must complete the required courses below, obtain at least state required scores on the MoGEA, and earn a minimum 2.75 GPA.
