Dear Prospective Student:

Thank you for your interest in the Coding Specialist Certificate Program. This Program is designed to provide you with the coding knowledge needed in today's healthcare environment. With the requirement and implementation for ICD-10-CM and ICD-10- PCS coding expected October of 2015, individuals wanting to become competent coders will need an education to enter into the coding profession.

Wherever there is health information, there is a need for the professional coder; acute care setting, ambulatory care, skilled nursing facility, home health, hospice, research, and provider's offices. Coders are asked to assist in decision-making, make ethical coding decisions in the workplace to prevent fraud and abuse, and maintain a commitment to coding integrity.

This packet contains all the information needed to apply for the Coding Specialist Certificate Program. This Program is part of the Health Information Management (HIM) Program curriculum and students accepted into the Coding Specialist Certificate Program must adhere to the College's and the HIM Program's policies, standards and code of ethics. The required core coding courses are offered in a one semester format every fall in conjunction with the Health Information Management Program. Once students have completed required prerequisite courses it will only take two semesters to complete the Coding Specialist Certificate. If a student chooses to continue their education in health information management through an Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degree in Health Information Management (HIM) some of the courses required for the Coding Specialist Certificate will apply toward the AAS in HIM.

Note:

- If you completed the required writing, and reading courses with at least a "C" letter grade, the courses do not need to be retaken even if you need to retake the ACCUPLACER test. Retaking ENGL101 to improve previous letter grade is acceptable
- If you are transferring to MCC, and completed ENGL101 with at least a "C" letter grade, you only need to take the reading section of the ACCUPPLACER test if no previous scores on record.
- If you are a current or returning MCC student, and completed ENGL101 with at least a "C" letter grade, you only need to retake the reading section of the ACCUPPLACER test if scores are over three years or no previous scores onrecord.



If you have completed or tested out of ESL, you are expected to take and complete READ100 with at least a "C" letter grade or scored 110 on the ESL reading section of ACCUPLACER test.



Program Statement

Upon completion of this Program you will be eligible to sit for the AAPC's Certified Professional Coder (CPC) exam. With the implementation of ICD-10-CM and ICD- 10-PCS coding system there is a strong need for qualified coders. This credential will prepare you to work in an outpatient setting in hospitals, office-based physician practices, nursing homes, home health agencies, mental health facilities, and public health agencies.

Program Outcomes

- 1. Apply clinical classification and coding through the effective use of electronic applications and work processes.
- 2. Classify classification systems and nomenclatures and explain their purpose in healthcare facilities.
- 3. Apply diagnosis and procedure codes.
- 4. Analyze regulations and established guidelines in code assignment.
- 5. Evaluate coding accuracy through the use of clinical information found in the health record.
- 6. Resolve discrepancies between coded data and supporting documentation.
- 7. Apply appropriate ethical coding practices.

Program Succession

In order for the student to continue on to the next schedule semester in the Program the student must achieve a 75% (C) in <u>each</u> CODE course. In order for the student to remain in the HIM Program, they must receive a C in <u>all</u> courses to include both CODE and general education courses.

The student will be given the opportunity to repeat courses but after three attempts to pass the course, if the student has not achieved a passing grade, they will be dropped from the Program.



Application Deadline For Spring Start Is November 1st

Process for program application:

- 1. Formal acceptance to MCC (if you are not an MCC student you must complete the College application online at <u>www.mcckc.edu</u>)
- 2. Complete the Coding Program Application demographic form
- 3. Complete an essay that addresses why you are interested in beginning a careerin health information management. The essay should be one page, single-spaced with 11-12 point font.
- 4. A copy of your unofficial transcripts

If required coursework was completed at other academic institutions other than MCC then you will need to submit OFFICIAL transcripts to the: MCC Student Data Center 3200 Broadway Kansas City, MO 64111

The Student Data Center will determine course equivalencies and post them to the student's MCC transcript. Please note that the Program Coordinator does not make the final determination regarding accepted previous college course work. Please note that it may take a few weeks for transcripts to be requested, sent, and reviewed. Therefore, it is imperative that the student does not delay in requesting transcripts for the Student Data Center review. The transcripts should be at the Student Data Center no later than August 15th for the application deadline of September 1st.

- 5. Submit the Program Application Form, completed essay and transcripts to the Coding Specialist Certificate Program by **November 1st** for the Spring (January) semester. Applications received after the application deadline will only be reviewed and considered if open seats remain in the program.
- 6. Please note: if you are in the process of completing the prerequisites for the Program apply by the deadline and once the final grades have been posted an official acceptance letter will be sent indicating that you have been accepted into the Program.



Program Admission Requirements:

- 1. Must complete HIM100 Medical Terminology and HLSC108 Anatomy and Physiology for Health Professions, OR BIOL109 OR BIOL110 AND BIOL210.
- 2. If the student is <u>not</u> transferring in 12 or more college credits, it is <u>recommended</u> that they complete HLSC100 Introduction to Health Professions.
- 3. Science courses must have been taken within the last five years.
- 4. Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.
- 5. Completed Program Application Packet received by **November 1**st for the Spring (January) semester.

Completed program application documents can be submitted one of three ways:

Students can expect to hear if they have been accepted into the program in December for Spring start.

Student Selection Process:

- 1. Completed program application received by **November 1**st for the Spring.
- 2. Documented evidence of a grade of "C" or better in all prerequisite courses
- 3. Documented evidence of a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or greater
- **4.** Essay completion

Students interested in completing the program on a part-time basis will need to follow the steps listed above and if accepted into the program will work directly with the Program Coordinator to outline the appropriate course sequence required for the degree plan.
