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MCC-MAPLE WOODS VETERINARY TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM

Veterinary technicians are integral members of the veterinary healthcare team. The MCC-Maple Woods Veterinary Technology program prepares students to perform the nursing and clinical skills utilized in veterinary practice and research for small, large and laboratory animals.
