

**Articulation Agreement
Between
Metropolitan Community College
And the
College of Human Ecology at Kansas State University**

September 5, 2012

Metropolitan Community College (MCC) and the College of Human Ecology at Kansas State University (K-State) agree to provide the courses listed on the attached curriculum guide as a joint two-plus-two distance education program that will enable students to meet the requirements for the Associate of Arts degree at MCC and the Bachelor of Science degree in Family Studies and Human Services at K-State. It is also agreed that the courses required for the Associate of Arts degree at MCC will be accepted by K-State as meeting the requirements for the first two years of the Bachelor of Science degree in Family Studies and Human Services at K-State, as shown in the attached curriculum guide.

MCC and the College of Human Ecology at K-State agree to provide student support services including admissions, academic advising, library access, technical support and others services as needed and appropriate. The staffs at both institutions will coordinate their student services to assure a smooth transition from one institution to the other.


MCC and the College of Human Ecology at K-State will continue to review the course offerings on the attached curriculum guide and will collaboratively make any revisions. Any revisions or changes will continue to apply toward degree completion for the programs in this agreement. MCC and the College of Human Ecology at K-State will assure that all students who begin this program will be able to complete it within a reasonable period of time.



The Division of Continuing Education (DCE) at K-State and MCC will mutually promote and market this program, especially to students who need access to distance education programs.


