### Transfer Guide for Metropolitan Community College

**Admission to the Upper Level BSBA Degree Program** - Transfer students may be admitted to the lower level business program or to another major outside of business depending on the total number of credit hours and the number of upper level admission courses completed before transferring. Admission into the upper level emphasis area is competitive and based upon the UM GPA and the available space in the emphasis area requested.

To be eligible for application to an upper level emphasis area:

- 1) Students must be in residence full-time (at least 12 hours) at MU for one semester.
- 2) Students must have a 2.600 UM cumulative GPA, but that does not guarantee admission. The UM GPA includes only grades from MU, UMSL, UMKC or Missouri S&T.
- 3) A minimum of 45 semester hours of college-level credit must be completed. Students need to be admitted by the semester after earning their 60<sup>th</sup> hour or they will have to transfer out of the Trulaske College of Business.
- 4) Upper level admission courses are required to be completed or in-progress. The upper level admission courses are listed below.
- 5) 70 Professional Development Program Points (approximately 7 events) are required. The Professional Development Program (PDP) is a program that goes beyond the classroom to prepare Trulaske College of Business undergraduate students for a successful career. Points are earned by attending seminars and other activities. Once admitted to upper level, students must continue to earn PDP points.
